Based on the 2020 end of year (EOY) DIBELs composite score, students in grades K-3 will increase their reading proficiency by 10% and will reflect more than a year's worth of growth based on the 2021 EOY DIBELs assessment. In addition, students in grades 3-5 will increase Language Arts proficiency by 10%.

## Action Plan Steps

We will use the School Land Trust funds to pay for the following:

- a portion of our counselor's salary
- a portion of our music teacher's salary
- art paraprofessional's salary
- HAL paraprofessional's salary
- take home library paraprofessional's salary
- a portion of the salary for our kindergarten interventionist
- take home library books
- The Great Artists curriculum
- supplies for art and music

\*The music and art teachers at Sunset will use a variety of teaching methods to meet the requirements of the Utah core standards. These teachers will also collaborate frequently with each team to coordinate topics being taught.

\*Students will increase the quality of their instruction by learning how to self regulate in times of emotional stress and behavior by being taught the necessary life coping skills by our school counselor. \*The differential needs of students will be met by providing extended learning activities for gifted students in reading with daily HAL groups, daily take-home leveled books provide essential reading opportunities for students, and our Kindergarten paraprofessional will target the individual daily academic needs of students.

Behavioral/Character Education/Leadership Component	School counseling will provide counseling programs in three critical areas: academic, personal/social, and career. Our school counselor will provide services and programs to help students resolve emotional, social or behavioral problems and help them develop a clearer focus or sense of direction. Effective counseling programs are important to the school climate and a crucial element in improving student achievement. * Several studies found that elementary guidance activities have a positive influence on elementary students' academic achievement. * School counseling interventions have reported success in helping students reduce test anxiety. * School counselors in collaborative efforts can implement both systemic and programmatic changes in schools and communities to prevent students from dropping out of school. * Counseling decreases classroom disturbances. Counseling services support teachers in the classroom and enable teachers to provide quality instruction designed to assist students in achieving high standards. Students in schools that provide counseling services indicated that their classes were less likely to be interrupted by other students, and that their peers behaved better in school. * In studies on the effects of a small group counseling approach for failing elementary school students, 83 percent of participating students showed improvement in grades. * School counselors, due to their training, experience and accessibility are considered to be the best-equipped school-based professionals to develop and implement both prevention and intervention programs for youth at risk.
