There is a plan in place for the grades which didn't make the growth we would have liked. We will focus on Student Engagement during Tier 1 reading and ensuring that everyone is doing everything in class. Kristin will also be meeting weekly with specific grade levels to help them with planning their instruction.

2) Review school needs and propose 2025-2026 Sunset Trust Land Expenditure Plan

We will get our official 2025-2026 Trustland Amount tomorrow, but we are estimating \$71,000. Mrs. Campbell talked about how we will use the money. She stated that it will look very similar to this year, where we will pay for a Wellness para, a portion of the Counselor's salary, a Behavior Tech, Reading paras, and substitutes for the teachers to be able to attend data meetings three times a year.

Megan Pomeroy wanted to know if there was data to support having a wellness room and a behavior tech. Mrs. Campbell said that by having both the wellness room and and behavior tech, we are able to help students regulate their emotions and therefore get back to class quicker, which helps them learn more. The behavior tech is helpful in the classrooms to help with students who may be a distraction or disruption to the learning environment of other students. Mrs. Campbell said that we can have Jana Timmons, the counselor, give a report on the benefits our school has seen from having both the wellness room and a behavior tech.

3) Council open-forum

Mrs. Campbell gave a update on safety at the school and what has happened since our last meeting where we discussed safety.

We will be getting six additional cameras for our school - 2 of which will be outside, and 4 which will be inside. The cameras will help give us access to the locations which are current blind spots in the school, which have turned into hot spots for the school.

The district is scheduled to install the safety door which will separate the school lobby from the lunchroom this summer.

The next safety update will be to all interior doors within the next couple of years.

We will meet again on Feb 11, 2025 to approve the Trustlands Budget for the 2025-2026 school year.
